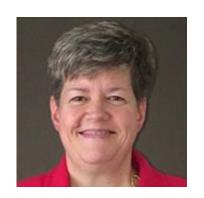

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Health Disparities and Disability

According to CDC, between 37-57 million of Americans report having some level of a disability; 12.5% of population has a disability which "seriously limits" them

- People with a disability are:
 - Over twice as likely to not see a doctor due to cost
 - Over 30% more likely to be obese
 - 60% more likely to smoke
 - Over 2.5 times more likely to develop diabetes
 - Women with disabilities less likely to have a current mammogram
 - Women with disabilities less likely to have a current pap test
 - Over 3.5 times more likely to have a cardiovascular disease (18-44 y.o)

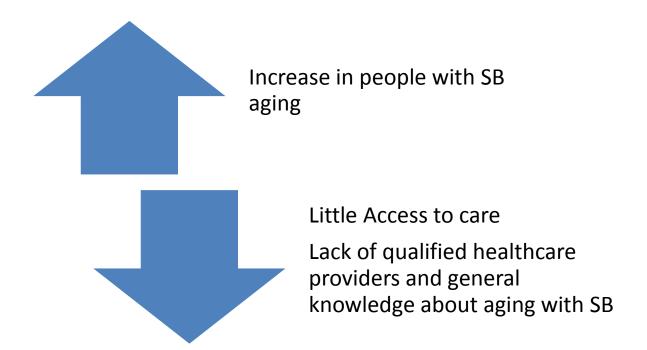

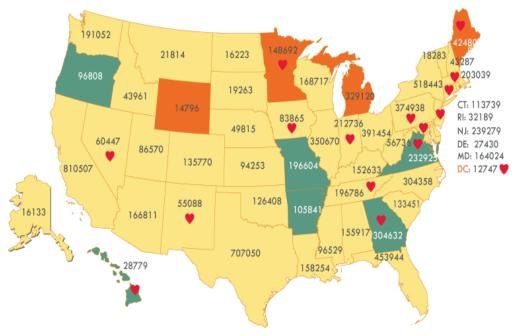

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Disability as a Health Disparity

- As a group, people with disabilities fare far worse than their nondisabled counterparts across a broad range of health indicators and social determinants of health.
- Adults with disabilities are 2.5 times more likely to report skipping or delaying health care because of cost.
- Although they have higher rates of chronic diseases than the general population, adults with disabilities are significantly less likely to receive preventive care.

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Changes Required to Improve the Health of People with Disabilities

- Improved access to health care and human services,
- Increased data for decision-making,
- Strengthened health and human services workforce capacity,
- Explicit inclusion in public health programs, and
- Increased preparation for emergencies.

CMS - Office of Minority Health

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EFFORTS THUS FAR

US Access Board - Improving Health of People with Disabilities

- Workgroup has been closely monitoring status of proposed accessibility standard for medical accessibility - Section 4203 of Affordable Care Act requires US Access Board to issue accessibility standards for medical diagnostic equipment to accommodate adults with disabilities.
- Includes exam tables, exam chairs, weight scales, mammography equipment and imaging equipment.
- Board is meeting September 14th to vote on final standards for medical diagnostic equipment. We will report back to Friends after Sept. 14th AccessBoard meeting.

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EFFORTS THUS FAR

Workgroup monitors emerging issues as they arise - EX. starting to look at full implementation of Section 4302 of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) which strengthens federal data collection efforts by requiring all national efforts collect information on race, ethnicity, sex, primarily language and disability status.

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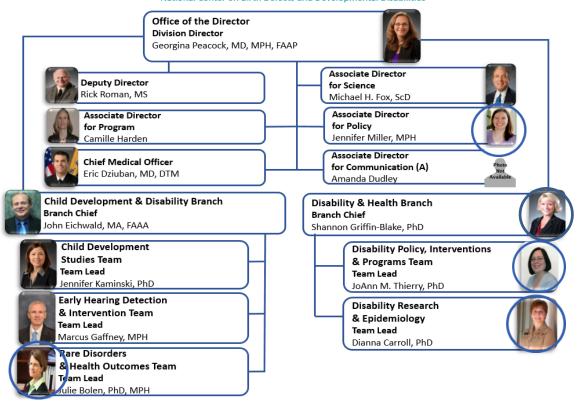

About the Project

- The Including People with Disabilities Public Health Workforce Competencies was a multiyear Project funded by
 - Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC)
 - National Center for Birth Defects and Developmental Disabilities (NCBDDD)
 - Office for State, Tribal, Local, And Territorial Support (OT))
- Developed by a national committee comprised of disability and public health experts
- Provide foundational knowledge about the relationship between public health programs and health outcomes among people with disabilities
- Primarily designed for professionals already working in the public health field but can also be used for public health workforce training



About the Competencies

- Compared to people without disabilities, people with disabilities are at a higher risk for poor health outcomes such as hypertension, obesity, falls-related injuries, and depression.
- Knowledge about the health status and public health needs of people with disabilities is essential for addressing health disparities.
- Most public health training programs do not include curriculum on people with disabilities and methods for including them in core public health efforts.
- Improve the health of people with disabilities by building a stronger public health workforce skilled in ways to include people with disabilities in all public health efforts.

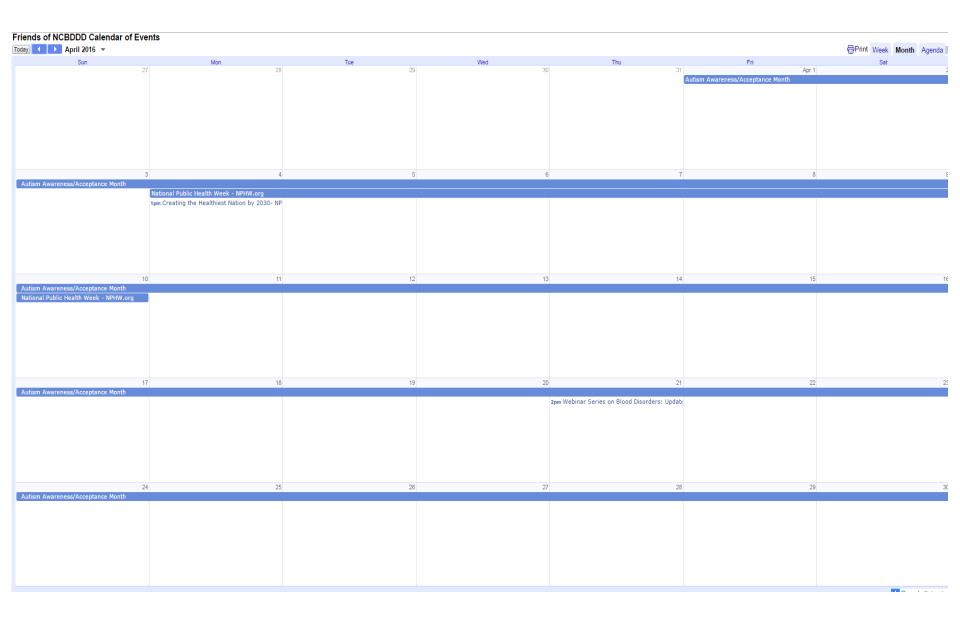
